COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed for students who have successfully completed Japanese language study up through the 202 level and are motivated to further their language skills. This course emphasizes reading cultural materials and discussing/presenting various topics for communicative purposes. Authentic materials and socio-cultural contexts will be the basis for discussions. Basic writing and presentation skills will be conducted as well to acquire understanding how language informs and shapes its culture. Will cover Lesson 1, 2, 3 and 5 in the “新・中級から上級への日本語” textbook. Classes will be conducted in Japanese, except in situations where instruction in English is deemed necessary.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, students will be expected to acquire:

- Reading skills: comprehend authentic reading materials with a large number of vocabulary, and complex grammar and rhetoric.
- Communication skills: nurture appropriate discourse based on oral practice such as presentations and discussions.
- Basic writing skills: learn the process of writing.
- Socio-cultural knowledge about Japan.

No make ups will be arranged unless you have a valid reason for missing class (e.g., medical or family emergency).

All of the tests and quizzes will be graded, and all make ups will receive partial credit (90% of maximum and only 85% of maximum if there is an intervening weekend). You must take the make ups before the subsequent class starts. If you know that you will miss a class, then you can take a quiz any time before the missed class and not lose any credit.

Students must take the quizzes, tests and complete the Final Exam Project on the days scheduled. No make ups will be allowed unless you have a valid reason. The time and place for the makeup exam should be scheduled ASAP with the instructor.
